71st ANNIVERSARY OF THE LIBERATION OF LOS BAÑOS Commemorating this successful operation is important to both Americans and Filipinos, important to both Americans and Filipinos.



On February 23, 1945 members of B company, 1st Bn., 511th Infantry Regiment parachuted into Los Baños internment camp, where they were joined by over 100 Philippine guerrillas to rescue over 2,100 civilian internees being held prisoner by the Japanese. After they were freed, the prisoners were then ferried to safety by the 672nd AMTRAC Bn. This year marks the 71st anniversary of the rescue.

JUNE 2016 - VOICE OF THE ANGELS

On February 23, 1945 exactly 71 years ago today, the Japanese interment camp on Luzon, near Baker Hall at the UP College of Agriculture (UPCA), was successfully liberated by the American troops together with heroic and courageous Filipino guerillas. The Raid of Los Baños, as it is known, was hailed as one of the most successful military rescue operations in modern history, as stated by Ret. Col. Ciscar during his speech honoring the liberators of Los Baños, both Americans and Filipinos. He associated the success of the operations to the determination of all involved and stated that "only those who are prepared to fight a war will attain success".

2,000 CIVILIANS SET FREE BY DARING RAID AT LOS BAÑOS

It was a privilege and an honor to have represented the 11th Airborne Division during the commemoration of the 71st anniversary of the Liberation of Los Baños held at the UPLB Campus on February 19, 2016. The event was spearheaded by the Philippine Veterans Bank together with UP Los Baños and the Veterans Federation of the Philippines, Inc. The activities for the day focused on the context of lessons learned from the war, recognition of the heroism and bravery of the men and women both young and old and the collective actions that led to the liberation of Los Baños from the Japanese.

Veterans, UP Los Baños and UP Rural High School management/ staff as well as representatives from the National and Local Government of Laguna have graced the occasion. Ms. Gemma Cruz Araneta, former Secretary of Tourism (1998 to 2001) and the first Filipino and Asian to win the Miss International Title (1964) was the guest of honor. Also present were UP Los Baños Chancellor Fernando Sanchez Jr., UP Los Baños Dean of College of Arts and Sciences Dr. Felino Lansigan, Ret. Col. Michael Angelo Ciscar from the Veterans Federation of the Philippines, Prof. Ricardo Jose of UP Diliman, Ret.

Gen. Gregorio Pio Catapang Jr. from Bases Conversion Development Authority and some war veterans with their families headed by Mrs.

The program started with a morning mass at 7AM at St. Therese of the Child Jesus Parish church followed by a floral offering ceremony at the Baker Memorial Hall and the commemorative program at the UP Los Baños Grandstand. The guest speakers shared their views about the liberation of Los Baños in different perspectives: military, academe, and as a war veteran. Focuses of message are the lessons learned from the past and way forward to the future. History doesn't give much emphasis on the roles of the Filipino guerillas during the war according to Prof. Ricardo Jose of UP Diliman. It is noteworthy to retell history and "share the combined efforts of the Filipino guerillas and American troops to liberate the internees". He further stated that this "textbook rescue operations" is not only for the American paratroopers but for Filipino guerillas also.


The great lessons from this rescue operation should be emphasized with the youth of today as stated by Ret. Gen. Pio Catapang Jr. He further recommends the need to "highlight the heroism and courage of the liberating forces, the sacrifices of the internees and civilians so the youth will know and understand our own history". Mrs. Sofia Tidon, a war veteran shared her experience during the war, how her parents and sibling got killed thus forcing her to come and join the guerilla movement. She emphasized that after all that had happened, "I realize the need to forgive. To learn from the past and cut the negative cycle and instead focus to promote unity, service and peace."
